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

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AGING WITH BEAUTY Modern

Hodern Grandma's Glamorous

Life

We have heard it before; sixty is the new fifty, or even the new thirty. We live in an age that glorifies the beauty of youth, and the boom in cosmetic surgery is Exhibit A of society's insecurity over aging. Yet as women crowd cosmetic counters at the first sign of crow's feet, a special group of "silver-haired" beauties thinks nothing of displaying their wrinkles to the public. Iris Apfel, a 90 year old fashion darling, has become a kind of fashion muse in the United States, inspiring everyone from designers to the editors of glossy magazines, while western modeling legend China Machado remains in hot demand on the catwalk, a picture of grace and beauty at age 82.

China is starting to catch this wave of celebrating beauty with age. One of these pioneers is Zhao Zhenhua, an 85 year old model in Nanjing, who still performs on stage and has led or served as fashion adviser for several modeling teams made up of elderly women. Even in street clothes and casual conversation, she exudes elegance. Her hair, silver and curly, gracefully frames a face with wrinkles, yes, but also with eyes that glimmer confidently and a smile that warms. Her poise is impeccable; Grandma Zhao

kept her back ramrod straight during a two-hour interview.

When asked about the anxiety over aging, she lets loose that smile. "I do not share this worry," she says. "I don't know why, but people always say that I am increasingly delightful to the eyes as I age."

Before injuring her leg during a fall last year, Grandma Zhao wore nothing but high heels; the higher the better. Every pair she owned had heels close to 10 centimeters; "I was so accustomed to them that flats make me uncomfortable". Grandma Zhao walked in these shoes for two hours every day to lose weight.

Whenever she walks down the street, Grandma Zhao is noticed for her beauty; strangers greet her with a smile or approach to chat. When she visited her son in Vancouver five years ago, at age 80, she

showed up at the airport sporting a navy-blue windbreaker with shiny scarlet collar and swallowtail, leather boots and black beret decorated with a gold petrel. She recalls fellow passengers offering enthusiastic praise. "Beautiful!" they said. Grandma Zhao smiled back. "You do not look like a Chinese lady at all!" one Westerner commented. "But I am 100 percent Chinese," she answered, "Never stepped out of China before."

Despite her youthful spirit, Grandma has weathered numerous difficulties.





As an 8 year old, she survived the Nanjing Massacre, narrowly escaping the cruel excesses of the invading Japanese soldiers by shaving her head bald to make her look like a boy.

She was also sickly in her youth, plagued by stomach troubles. "My face looked like wax," she recalls, but jokes that her pallor may have had an upside; in those days, fair skin was associated with society's upper crust. By the time she was 40, a bone spur in her spine forced her to walk with a stick. When she was 51, she collapsed under heavy work load as a government employee and a gastrectomy left her with only a fifth of her stomach intact. At age 80, with a role in the movie "Nanjing, Nanjing" (a Nanjing Massacre based flick directed by Lu Chuan) she carried a cardiac pacemaker but kept it a secret from the director. "I was not defeated. I never allow myself to be defeated," she says. "I always regard a serious illness as an ailment and an ailment as a breeze. After all, health is not only the basis of beauty; it is beauty itself, and I need to fight for it."

Grandma Zhao can track the twists and turns of China's modern history through fashion. She recalls the heady, early days of the founding of a new, revolutionary China, a time of close relations with Soviet Union. As leader of the Women's Federation, she took the initiative in wearing the Soviet-style platye, a one-piece dress that featured round-collars, loose short sleeves, pleated hemlines and belt. However, in the Era of Confinement (1950-1976) termed by Hou Hongbin in New Weekly, the author mentions "waves after waves of political movement finally got the better of modern girls, who gave in to Lenin coat." The Chinese leaders held out the slogan that "time is different,

and man and woman are equal." As a result, Hou says that "man and woman all dressed the same, looked the same and worked the same."

Grandma Zhao well remembers the Lenin coat, featuring double lines of buttons, slanting pockets and belt,



with varying collars spelling the only difference between the men's and women's version. Blue, grey and black were the only colors of choice. Whenever a meeting took place, she recalls, the room was a drab sea of grey. "It is an era when we wanted to pursue beauty but couldn't. It was even worse during the two decades of Cultural Revolution, when everyone tried their best to stay plain, because beauty was a crime," Grandma Zhao recalls. Though free of any "titles" or ties to those deemed "reactionaries," her beauty thrust her into the public eye and she was paraded on the street wearing a dunce cap for fabricated "crimes." People shouted insults and, with sarcasm, called her "Xi Shi" (one of the four most famous beauties in Chinese history), accusing her of using beauty for anti-communist purposes. "Our minds were confined, and it's normal for people to take their personal revenge in the time of crisis," she says, showing remarkable calm.

She picked up modeling as a hobby in her later years, after retiring from her government job. She was enthusiastic about learning different styles of dress and taught herself to catwalk. Besides being an icon of beauty in Nanjing, she spread the joys of modeling to Canada during a six-month


visit, becoming the idol of elderly women in the Chinese community soon after arriving.

"I took part in their gatherings and they really liked my way of dressing," she says. "They are not unlike Chinese elderly ladies, shelving their shiny clothing in the closet and never daring to wear them in public." She had a suggestion; "why don't we form a team and model?" The other grandmas cheered like little girls and rushed to bring their beautiful dresses into the daylight. Grandma Zhao taught them to coordinate colors; "Never exceed three colours in a single outfit. The bigger the colour contrast, the better. Never be ashamed of wearing dazzling colors." Some of the women were shy about being on stage, and their nervousness made them walk awkwardly. Grandma Zhao taught them how to walk with ease; "Just like when you are walking on the ground, arms swinging close to your body," she remembers telling them. "And remember; always smile." Only ten days later, the grandma models stepped onto the stage in colourful traditional Chinese dresses such as the gipao (cheongsam) and performed in the inaugural meeting of the Chinese community in Vancouver. Encouraged by the surprising popularity, the modeling team practiced with greater zeal and continued even Grandma Zhao went back to China six months later, becoming more famous in the process.

On the fashion of today, the grandma who has witnessed so many changes in the standards of what is beauty, is nostalgic, one could say obstinate, in favouring traditional, less "gaudy" clothing. "Why bother baring so much of your body and dressing like a colorful peacock?" she says, showing a teenager's pout. "We Chinese always learn just the skin-deep beauty of Westerners without really getting the essence." The essence to which she refers is to show one's individuality; "To be yourself", she insists, no matter whether one has the "phoenix eyes" that are esteemed in Chinese tradition or the more marble-shaped eyes of westerners with long lashes.

As for Grandma Zhao's beauty regime, "A glass of water and an apple every morning when you get up," she says. "Simple exercise before sleep. No drinking water after 9 p.m. More alkaline water, less tap water. Stick to these, and you will be as beautiful as I am!"

She winks and lets loose that smile again. W





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RISKS OF COSMETIC SURGERY IN CHINA

Today's social aesthetic values have led to a craze for plastic surgery, resulting in the number of clinics providing the service increasing at a stellar rate. About three million people had plastic surgery on the mainland in 2010 in an industry worth an annual ¥15 billion yuan, as newly rich Chinese began to tend to their appearance. However, the results can be devastating, especially when beauty seekers make hasty decisions or choose risky options in an under-regulated market. Loose industry statutes has led to a surging number of botched operations and legal disputes.

BLACK HOSPITALS AND THE NON-QUALIFIED

Despite the existence of rules and regulations, the industry has become so lucrative that some beauty salons perform cosmetic procedures without the proper certification. A recent raid by health authorities on 11 cosmetic surgery clinics across China found that less than half met national standards. Many feel China's obsession with plastic surgery has gone badly awry, as more and more unlicensed, unskilled and unscrupulous practitioners jump into an increasingly lucrative, yet largely unregulated industry. While government-run hospitals adhere to stricter standards with more experienced doctors, the same cannot be said of so-called "black hospitals" and other private facilities that perform operations secretly, attended over by surgeons who lack ethics and with no loftier an aim than to make money.

Wang Bei, a 24-year-old former talent show contestant, died in the operating room in November during a routine plastic surgery procedure in Wuhan, capital of Hubei province. Later, investigations showed that her surgeon, Wang Liangming, never fully qualified as a practitioner.

LACK OF PARTICULAR PRACTICAL LAW

Despite the fact that there are some applicable laws and regulations, such as the General Principles of Civil Law, the Consumer Protection Law, and the Regulation on the Handling of Medical Accidents, there is no particular practical law to regulate the beauty treatment and hairdressing industries. Furthermore, the Regulation on the Handling of Medical Accidents is only employed in the event of a customer disfigured by botched operations by qualified hospitals or facilities. Should the salon be unqualified, the victim defaults to the Consumer Protection Law as a reference to obtain double compensation on grounds of defraud conduct, a situation that in practice is not good for the protection of consumer interests.

Unique Ruling in Courts of Law

One Chinese man divorced his wife and received a ¥750,000 settlement for "lost opportunities" after his wife gave birth to an "amazingly ugly" baby and it was revealed that the wife had hidden her own "ugliness" with cosmetic surgery. Common sense would lead a reasonable person to believe that the judge would toss such a ridiculous sounding lawsuit off the docket, but that is not what happened.

To better protect the rights of patients, the government should take immediate legal measures to control the market and regulate the plastic surgery industry. Efforts should also be strengthened in raising standards for beauty salons and plastic surgeons.

Meanwhile, it is conceivable that some patients develop mental problems, such as addiction to cosmetic surgery. Surgeons need to be sensitive to this issue, and communicate with patients thoroughly before agreeing to carry out any cosmetic procedures.

rom mixer to skin, he looked so happy, painting away like an angel. Wang Haoran was at peace with sketching his art, placing paint on flesh eternal. The magical beauty of a full rainbow of colour came to life as he held the machine and painted away. The skin was taut, and now red with extending lines of black elegantly becoming a skull.

On the creation of living art, with great thought and philosophical perception Master Wang observed, "Do you know that art has a connection. Once you learn something, you can teach yourself... And if you love it, you can easily learn it!"

Master Wang's wife, Qi Shiying chimed in with her own principles, as she proudly showed off her husband's work, "Tattoo is a belief. For many it's fashion! It's to express a kind of emotion, without words. People often use tattoos to say what they cannot express in words!"

In Wang Haoran, Naniing has transformed a painter of classical Chinese art into a connoisseur of tattoos. After watching Chinese traditional masters of body art do it in the old-fashioned way, he finally realised there was the potential for him to become part of this life. In reality, Wang's studies were also not helping to make ends meet. His radical thought at the time was that one day tattoos in China could become a source of income, while in this alternative world he could also become a part thereof and feel happiness. It was an excuse to do what he loved; to spend more time with art. Over the following 15 years, Wang would perfect this art, becoming Master in the process.

Tattoos have never been particularly popular, not even in western culture but that did change with liberalism. The same openness is now engulfing China and Nanjing, where tattoos have grown into a popular and respectable form of cultural art over the last two decades. Known prior as the "Kiss of Death", a tattoo, especially a noticeable one, would shun one from jobs and

> career opportunities. The so called "Scarlett Letter" in the past carried a negative connotation with an underworld of criminal activity. In ancient times tattoos were only found on warriors, slaves or deserters; the only "semi-legal" profession that could sport a tattoo (based on stereotype) came to be the military.

> Now it is an altogether different China; those adorned with tattoos are far removed from the typical stereotypes. While young people are needless to say more open to the idea, one still needs to be over 18 before stepping into the Master's parlor. Wang comments that the bulk of his clients are typi-

cally under 30, while females now account for approximately 60%. The young women may still be aoina for traditional butterflies and flowers on the ankle or back of the shoulder, but the intent is often to show off their elegant bodies when wearing dresses or high-heeled shoes. On the other hand, the gents often continue to request the characters and symbols of China through, for example, the proud showing of a dragon.

The principles, feelings, beliefs and passions of tattoos that last forever aside, everything still has a price. These days a small tattoo perhaps 3 cm in size may set one back ¥500 or more at Master Wang's Kuangren Tattoo (南京狂人馆), located at 107 Zhongshan Nan Lu. Yet, one pays for quality; noted for the design, beauty and quality of his work, Wang is now regarded as not only the best in Nanjing, but also Jiangsu province. Clients are people from all walks of life, with nowadays more and more foreigners coming in to get "inked". Note that it is advised to make a reservation two days ahead if the desired tattoo is small, while for something over 30 cm, best to make an appointment two weeks in advance; work on a tattoo of this size usually takes five hours.

In the days of old, many called Wang Haoran a crazy dreamer. Yet, our modern world is made out of craziness and dreams; new ideas that transform society. Never a fad, and always the symbolism that identifies a person forever, the once hitherto underworld of the tattoo is now very much above ground. Now it is the urban professional that comes through the parlors' doors. And they are not going to hide their tattoos anymore.



Ideals: It's What They Look For

According to Marie Claire Magazine, as well as a huge number of my Chinese female acquaintances, that the ideal image of beauty includes pale skin is a huge factor. However, this is where it gets a bit confusing. I have heard some people say that a pronounced nose is a thing of beauty, while a small nose is really the standard. Heavy work outs and gym culture have yet to make a deep impact on Chinese culture, thus women tend to focus more on what goes on inside than out by focusing more on restricting food intake or ingesting certain foods and teas that are meant to help one lose weight.

Some Yummy and Not So Yummy Treatments

Chinese traditional medicine is known to use natural methods to primarily prevent disease and cure pre-existing conditions. However, acupuncture, as a beauty treatment, is not only prevalent in China but has also been catching on abroad for some years now. Acupuncture is said to increase blood flow to the face (which enhances healthy colouring) and increase elastin and collagen to the face by stimulating certain facial points, thereby creating a more youthful look. Herbal remedies are used to enhance complexion and keep skin healthy. Fruits such as dried persimmon

(taken once or twice daily) can keep skin glowing, while other concoctions can be found at shen-nong.com, a valuable English language resource for information, facts, and remedies from the world of Traditional Chinese Medicine. For clear skin, try some detoxifying drinks such as oolong tea, which can also help with weight loss. According to Chinese doctors, if the liver is functioning properly, your blood will be kept at its cleanest and your skin at its finest. So avoid tempting treats such as alcohol or junk food that might compromise your liver. Other skin treatments known to keep skin glowing and youthful are pearl powder, fresh ground mint paste (also applied to the skin), and rice water made with dry organic rice soaked in clean water which can remove oil and impurities from the skin.

WINE EXPRESSION



The subtle assassin

If you buy enough wine to store some then an insidious danger may be lurking in a corner of your apartment; you will know nothing about this uninvited, invisible and silent guest until it is too late. 2.4.6-Trichloroanisole (a.k.a. "Duff Cork") taint can be very faint, or very palpable, but whatever the degree of contamination it is killing the wine in your bottle. The wet cardboard effects of a contaminated cork are annoying enough when discovered at home, and worse when you must address a restaurant sommelier with your suspicions and sufficient élan to have the bottle replaced; excruciating work even when successful. This tyranny of cork closures is estimated to affect between three and five percent of all bottles; surely an unacceptable risk for such a pricey consumable as wine.


Enter the screw cap?

Some still believe that corks are entwined with the tradition and mystery of wine, bottle variation and rituals involving a steel spiral to "do the honours"; essential to the aesthetics of the whole experience. Good luck to them but I remember I used to get a similarly perverse thrill from kick-starting my first motorbike, and on the third (or fifteenth) stroke she, usually, rumbled into life. With a smear of oil across the cheeks I was finally off, man and machine now melded through the blood seeping from a scuffed and ringingly painful lower tibia. However, pulling myself on board a more muscular and sophisticated two-wheeled beast some years later, the simple press of a button was always met with an instantaneous purr. This was progress and is exactly my feeling about screw caps on wine bottles; better technology simply eliminating unnecessary hassle and risk.

Corks are not just the bastion of hopeless romantics to be fair. Breathing, at a micro level, is a much cited argument in favour of cork closures for wines headed to the cellar for some years, but there is now strong science to suggest that oxygen is a spoiler of wine maturation in the bottle that the screw cap eliminates most efficiently. Truly time will tell with long aged wines under a screw cap, but the market is already speaking volumes with an emphatic rise from an estimated 100 million bottles ten or so years ago to approximately three billion now, from the seven billion or so sealed worldwide each year. Here are two to take for a spin, sure in the knowledge that you will be drinking the wine its maker intended.

The Stump Jump 2008 (¥149, BHG) hails from Australia's Adelaide hills; one of the white "Stumps" from producers d'Arenberg, comprising Riesling, Sauvignon, Marsanne and Rousanne grapes that makes for a zippy, vivacious, completeness of all component parts. Herbaceously appetizing on the nose and delivering vibrant and refreshing fruit across the mouth where lemon, melon and a trace of lime, along with firm acidity, lead an invigorating attack on the taste buds. A lot going on in the glass but it is not Byzantine by any means and will make genial shellfish company. Serve well-chilled, but not frozen, on a hot day and put the spring back in your soporific step (17 points).

Marius Grenache/Syrah 2010 (¥98, Metro) is jammy, in an evocatively wild and brambly way, with a toothsome licorice edge. A lightish red from the warmth of southern France; engaging and supple, yielding a sliver of sweetness over time with a more strawberry definition to the fruit, courtesy of Grenache's gentle touch. After slightly chilling in the cooler, serve with fresh fruit, yoghurt and lightly buttered toast. The breakfast of champions (16.5 points).

OVERSEAS ICE CREAM CAKE



INGREDIENTS

- 1 box ice-cream in your favorite flavor
- 1 box ice-cream in another flavor
- 1-2 packages chocolate cookies
- 1 cup coconut flakes
- 5 chocolate bars
- 5 tablespoons cocoa
- 1 tablespoon cream
- Sweet bakers chocolate
- 1 cup butter

DIRECTIONS

- . Grease a springform baking pan. Set out ice-cream to come to room temperature.
- Crush the cookies. Melt butter and add cocoa to form a watery saste. Remove from heat and add crushed cookies and coconut lakes. Press into the bottom of the pan ensuring good coverage Cut chocolate bars into pieces and add to the first ice-cream flavor. Press into the springform pan. Place in refrigerator.
- Melt the remaining chocolate and cream together over a double boiler. Remove pan from refrigerator and pour melted chocolate over ice- cream layer. It should turn solid almost immediately. Return to refrigerator to harden.
- Remove from refrigerator and make sure chocolate layer is hard. Add last layer of ice-cream. Return to refrigerator, Just as the top is starting to firm up, decorate the top with candies or fruit. Don't use anything with gelatin in—it freezes hard as rock and is impossible to chew. Put the cake into the freezex.
- To serve: remove from freezer 20 minutes before serving. Remove the sides of the springform pan. Using hot water to warm a sharp knife, cut into slices. Must remain in freezer!

World Class Manufacturing 7: EHS

■ D_{ISASTERS!}

Major recent headlines, from the fertiliser plant explosion in Texas, reinforce the need for a wider share of responsibility and implementation of Environment, Health and Safety (EHS) in the planning and development of urban areas, in addition to better practices on and off site. Environmental issues such as dead livestock in rivers and H9n7 are also the wrong headlines for any business.

The practice of EHS encompasses a wide variety of activities, and in more mature businesses, it is split into E and H&S, separating the aspects which impact the Environment in which the business operates, from those which impact the Health and Safety of the humans employed. It is widely accepted that one's work should not affect one's health, or that of the community in which the business operates.

KEY FACTORS NEEDED

Leadership

Whilst it is imperative that leadership adopts a strategic approach; ie this is a long term initiative that along with vision, commitment and practice without apology; it is one whereby the responsibility must be shared at all levels. Driving this down into the business separates the winners from the alsorans.

Objectives & Measures

Clear, measurable goals at all levels are needed, reflecting the responsibility sharing, so that all understand what is required of them. These must also be preventive in nature; leading not lagging. It is too late to report that you have killed or hurt someone that month. The measures should report safety briefings, inspections or near misses, for example, which should generate greater awareness and the ability to reduce known risks.

Training & Re-training

Persistence is key; once people know their responsibilities, then continuous training and refreshers are needed to ensure the correct practices are embedded in the organisation's culture.

FUTURE THINKING

To move from a traditional setup to a safety culture requires behavioural changes, in which a balance between the following major areas is required:


- **1.** *Compliance* This gives the business a Licence to Operate. Often the responsibility of the EHS function, this needs transferring to the relevant level.
- **2.** *Risk Elimination* Usually businesses will place business disruption analysis at a senior level. Hazards and risks also need evaluating regularly. As this is anticipative not reactive, it must involve experts in the subject.
- **3.** *Incident Investigation* A mature organisation learns from its mistakes so all the underlying causes of any incident should be thoroughly evaluated. Once a stable situation is reached with few or zero incidents, then potential risks need adding to the process.
- **4.** Business Planning processes All short and long term planning of change, large or small, should include a risk or EHS analysis. Change control should be established as a culture so that the impact of any change is assessed.
- **5.** Contractor involvement As more business processes are outsourced, it is tempting to feel that the contractor takes over the responsibility for their EHS, but this never leaves the business. It is up to those involved to include the contractors in the EHS activities of the business as partners and fully fledged team members.

BENEFITS

With the reduction of cost, through lower absenteeism and claims, possibly lower insurance premiums, and improved morale among a looked-after workforce, productivity rises which more than covers the costs of good EHS.

There are those who have been forced to change, sometimes derived from disasters experienced in the past. Some of these were too big for the company to survive. In managing your businesses, are you learning from others sufficiently to avoid being the next headline?

e left Naniing's Xianlin University Town mid morning and as we hit the Express Way heading south a distinctive flat topped range of hills appeared on our left confirming its ancient name "Heavenly Seal Mountain"; it being akin to a giant square seal or "chop", as they are called here in China.

the Dinglin Temple complex is at present rather chaotic indicating expansion and some improvement work in progress. After an interesting manoeuvre by our expert driver we drove in and out of the car park with a single flick of the steering wheel and up through the main gates towards the impressive saffron coloured temple with expectations running high of sighting our first Chinese leaning tower.

Pisa has had all the press and hype to date but initial research indicated that

Suzhou claims to have China's most impressive slanting tower with very little mention of our Nanjing monument. We were out to prove them wrong and assert Nanjing's very own slanting pagoda as the "acutest" of its kind.


The temple itself is nestled half way up Fangshan Mountain and we ascended through a pleasant wooded area where the spring blossom made the even the dullest area a feast of colour and joy. Locals had pitched a few of their day tents, kites were flying and a cohort of secondary school children with flags, jaunty red caps and matching face paint were coming down as we headed up towards the entrance. Good timing!

Unsure as to exactly where the slanting pagoda was located, but as entrance to the area was free, we ventured inside to the familiar smell of incense and towering halls with strange and vividly painted male monsters and benevolent Buddhas sitting and standing alongside each other in uneasy truce. As we moved towards the next pavilion a disconcerting image appeared through a glass room to our right of a quaint tilting tower cleverly displayed through rectangular panes of glass exacerbating its incongruous angles and drawing us to our goal!

> We were not disappointed; a petite but charming tower 12.5 metres in height built in the 12th century with seven floors of octahedral design constitutes Fanshan Leaning Tower. The human psyche remains fascinated by these weird gravity defying constructions that survive in spite of themselves, making Pisa a place of pilgrimage for young and old for centuries. Unlike Pisa however, the angle of tilt here in Fangshan is even more acute at 7.30 degrees.

Ten years ago a severe storm in the area caused the tower to shift precariously and the angle of tilt to increase. Architects and technical experts were summoned to see what could be done to keep the tower from imminent collapse. Concrete and steel cables were used to stabilize the base and preserve it for future generations of pilgrims and visitors.

A surreal China moment followed after the predictable photo shoot came to an end when a large white Californian Rabbit just like the one I had as a pet as a child hopped past us. Well it was Easter Weekend. Forget Pisa; we have our very own leading pagoda here in Nanjing, and next time you may get Santa thrown in for free too!



LEADERSHIP LEADING TO SELF RESPONSIBILITY

Leadership has proven to be essential, especially in times of crises and change. Short span change cycles, conflicting targets, incomprehensible technical and economic processes, upheaval of traditional orientation patterns can only be addressed when, at all levels of responsibility, trust in the innate potential, courage to take on calculated risks and the determination to act resolutely are givens.

High external pressure in business environments leads to greater inner insecurity and feelings of loss of control. Therein, the leader's task is to strengthen the performance potential of their team by making sure that:

- Team members deal with challenges in a constructive way and work out a form of orientation by themselves
- Every individual takes on responsibility for their own role in the process
- Enduring and stable trust-based relationships are
- Potential and competencies of the team members are continually improved and developed

Leadership has always been about handling difficult situations, hence all leaders look for orientation and support. Yet, its very concept implies that every leader will need, to a large degree, to provide a purpose, orientation and means to address the situation, as well as the necessary support.

Requirement Profile for Leadershib

Seven main attributes emerge as prerequisites for successful leadership behaviour in today's business

Responsibility and ownership Set oneself challenging goals, realize business objectives in a sustainable way, set priorities, communicate clearly and consistently, find solutions and implement thereof, define realities, act vigorously and with discipline.

Self-orientation Be aware of oneself, occupy and hold one's ground, take up a position even for sensitive or unpopular topics, deal with the new and the unknown confidently, display a broad and flexible spectrum of behaviour according to varying situations along with a clearly defined personal set of values.

Entrebreneurial spirit Able to develop and advance business, be highly driven to succeed, be sensitive to market signals and perceive business opportunities; envisage and design products, processes and behaviour from the point of view of the customer: have the ability and courage to strike new paths when necessary while consistently enforcing quality control.

Ability to provide purpose and to prompt certain behaviour Provide purpose and understanding, communicate in authentic and credible ways. mobilize energy and strong work performance, encourage others, sense powers at play within the organization and recognize key leverage points for success, provide clear accountability and a transparent task structure to enable others' success.


Successful relationship management Display a convincing and confident manner while proactively engaging with others, facilitate relationships based on partnership and cooperation, build and maintain networks with people of diverse backgrounds.

Emotional stability Have trust in one's own abilities and strengths, remain calm and reliable under pressure, understand one's own and others' feelings, tolerate frustration, be able to deal with disappointments while remaining ready to act at the same time, display appropriate and target-oriented conflict-resolution behaviour.

Eagerness to learn and develop Learn from experience, thereby broadening the range of response; grasp challenging situations and opportunities therein; collect feedback of one's own effect on others, take a long-term view and acting accordingly; develop a pioneering spirit by nourishing talent, developing team members and providing support in difficult situations; act resolutely on a lack of willingness to perform.

The leadership challenge of today consists of continuously working on these leadership qualities.





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hailand. Darting tuk tuks. Elephant rides. Night markets. Exotic street foods. Oil massages. Full moon parties. Island charms. But there is more to this beautiful country than most people envisage. It certainly is a treasure chest brimming with overlooked gems..



Bangkok is an infuriating place at times but there are refreshing options away from the tenacious pace of the Koah San Road tourist mecca. I do enjoy a brief wander around backstreet stalls and some of the street food is among the best to have ever graced my humble palate. A plethora of temples and galleries away from the crowds are worth a browse if energy can be summoned but to the North of this Land is where my travel companion and I wished to head.



A "luxury" night coach to Chiang Mai is the option we chose at a fair price however sleeper trains are also available. Both offer an average nights sleep but this is all part of the travelling experience. Arriving in a slightly disorientated state we hopped on a tuk tuk to the Moonmuang Road area which is located close to the Old City Wall. This intricate network of alleyways is awash with vendors, hawkers and guesthouses jostling for your business. We decided to spend a few days in Chiang Mai before journeying farther north. A pleasant wander around a night market was followed by splendid Shish Kebabs and domestic beers. The next day we found a trustworthy looking tuk tuk driver who also offered "tours" of the city, meaning that he could look after our needs for the day for a slightly inflated price. We agreed to his demands and had an interesting day sprinkled with mixed emotions. Firstly, we ventured to a monkey "training" school. I had certain reservations about such a place but the monkeys seemed well looked after and looked healthy and performed an entertaining show including bicycle tricks and solving simple mathematical riddles. But the second part of our day trip to the local tourist-ridden villages was a more sinister affair. A variety of minority families reside and trade at this location about 30km out of the main town. The famed 'Long Neck' women were the main attraction and posed for pictures and smiled for passersby but we later learned of the difficulties faced by them when attempting to leave these tourist hubs

while the term "human zoo" has been coined by concerned activist groups to describe such scenarios. We left happy to have interacted with these wonderful people but felt a pang of pity for their plight. Therefore after an additional day of wandering around a labyrinth of street stalls and food vendors we decided to head to another vicinity for an experience a touch more authentic and less touristy. We were not to be disappointed.

We were curious of the borderlands with Laos and Myanmar which are home to the infamous Golden Triangle, an integral zone for opium-based trading. But time permitted a trip to only Pai or Chiang Rai. We chose the latter which ultimately proved to be a sound choice. Arriving in Chiang Rai on a Sunday afternoon, the streets were fairly deserted and a tumbleweed rolling across our path would have been apt. This sleepy town had closed down early for the day and



aside from a few local marketplaces there was little to captivate the roaming eye. Only after arriving at a travel guide recommended hostel did our adventure begin. Therefore I would suggest a stay at the Chat House to be an absolutely necessity if ever visiting Chiang Rai. Almost all visiting foreign faces descended here and the main reason seemed to be the variety of enticing trips on offer. One such trip led to the highlight of any visit I have ever taken to Thailand and this was my fourth. We decided to embark on a two day trek visiting authentic minority villages sprawled across the local hill-sides. We were joined by two other friendly couples and the jovial tour guide Kai, followed loyally by Dodo, his canny canine companion. A dynamic duo they would turn out to be.


On day one we journeyed through winding forest pathways regularly resting to witness the breathtaking panoramic scenery of plush green pastures and azure skies. After arriving for an overnight stay with a local village family shortly before night fall, they prepared an outstanding Thai yellow curry accompanied by complimentary home-brewed whiskey. We talked deeply around a fire under a thousand stars and felt totally at ease. We retired for the night to bamboo huts on stilts with wicker mat beds and mosquito canopies.


On day two, we reconvened at daybreak and devoured a healthy serving of locally sourced fruit and headed for our next stop; a Chinese tea plantation,

home to migrant settlers from Yunnan Province. Before a hearty lunch we briefly bathed beneath a cascading waterfall as our guide Kai was fashioning cooking implements from freshly hacked bamboo. We were witnessing a man of incredible skill and endeavour in his natural habitat. We dined on giant leaves alongside a natural spring and life felt grand. After this fine feast, we meandered out of the hills past more ethnic minority settlements and finished our fulfilling trip in soothing hot springs. It truly was a phenomenal experience.

The following day we visited one of the only tourist attractions worth seeing in Chiang Rai town. The imaginatively named Cabbages and Condoms is a vegetarian restaurant aimed at promoting HIV/AIDS awareness in the region. This quirky establishment is juxtaposed with a Minorities Museum which explains the vibrant history behind local traditional ethnic clothing and culture, while also featuring a superb snapshot into the Opium Wars and Trade that includes interviews with foreigners past and present.

We then bid farewell to our humble yet incredibly talented hosts and set off for a night coach to Bangkok via Chiang Mai. The North of Thailand is geographically characterized by sprawling hills and tropical river valleys. The sumptuous cuisine and cultural excursions leave one largely satisfied and there is so much to do here in so little time. However, this is also a place where time and dates can simply drift away into the calm, refreshing breeze. Above all it is the people of Thailand which enable the traveller to feel welcomed and accommodated at almost every juncture. Due to their unrelenting friendliness and carefree attitudes to everyday life, a return voyage to this land is impossible for one to rule out.

What of Ducks and Cricket?

ust who are the Nanjing Disco Ducks and how are they involved in sport in Nanjing? To find out the answer to this question I went to join them for an afternoon of playing the original gentleman's sport, cricket.

A conglomeration of two teams, the Nanjing Disco Ducks comprise the Nongmin and the Bogans. The two teams play cricket against each other every Sunday at Nanjing Normal University. The participants are a diverse range of nationalities ranging from cricket playing nations to countries more associated with winter sports. It is also fair to say that this is a ramshackle lot.

The day I went to meet the teams and join in for my first experience of cricket in China the sun was shining brightly; it is a perfect day for cricket. I arrive at Nanjing Normal University's main gate and make my way through the university following what I hope is a fellow player. As we arrive at the playing field I discover that he luckily plays for the team I will be representing; the Bogans.

The Nanjing Disco Ducks have an increasing presence in the Nanjing sports scene. Nanjing cricket stalwart, Hamish Stevens, regales me with tales of back in 2008 when the Nongmin Cricket Club would play on a tennis court. What is certain is that serious cricket began in Nanjing in June 2009 with the advent of the first Nanjing 6's tournament.

A tournament where teams of six players compete in two innings of five overs, the Nanjing 6's began as a tour for the Shanghai Bashers Cricket Club. They wanted to play cricket outside of Shanghai and assisted with getting cricket in Nanjing organised. The Bashers helped arrange the cricket

gear (pads, bats etc.) and showed some of the Nanjing originals how to organise tournaments. Craig Haines, Tony Herbert and Azam Chattha were instrumental in setting up the Nongmin Cricket Club and Hamish, Jimmy Bice, Daz Major and Craig Berry were the brains and brawn behind the Bogans Cricket club.

After the first Nanjing 6's tournament, things began to snowball. The Nonamin and the Bogans starting to play each other on a regular basis, meeting every Sunday. As the Nanjing Disco Ducks' profile was raised so interest was sparked from outside organisations. The Nanjing International School (NIS) started to host the cricket at their ground and put it on the roster at their annual charity sports tournament. The Pfrang Association, an charity that raises money to provide education to underprivileged children in Jiangsu province, backs the tournament



every August. Organised by Andy Kay from NIS, this has helped to boost the profile of cricket in Nanjing.

As well as the Nanjing 6's tournament, the Ducks play in the Shanghai 6's and Xiamen 6's tournaments; chances for the club to take their members on tour and celebrate their love of cricket. The Xiamen tournament is an end of year party for the club where they can spend some time on the beach before the cold, dark winter sets in and the cricket gear is packed away for another year.

Jiangsu Sainty-2, Thailand Buriram-0

iangsu Sainty recorded their first win in the AFC Champions League with a resounding 2-0 over Buriram of Thailand on 2nd April. On a largely dull night the game sparked to life just before half time.

With a crowd of 35,700, almost ten thousand less than the first game against Vegalta Sendai of Japan, the home support was less fervent. However, as half time approached Sainty's dominance finally broke the Buriram resistance.

The home fans went wild in the 42nd minute as captain Lu Bofei drilled the ball into the bottom corner of the net. As the stadium was basking in the first ever goal scored by Jiangsu at home in the Asian Champions League, a flowing move was finished with a brilliant headed goal by Sun Ke, sparking scenes of wild rapture. Those two minutes were worth the 80BMB entrance fee alone.

The contest petered out in the second half as Sainty controlled the game and Buriram failed to assert themselves on the match; the half time procession of soldiers entering the stadium and posting themselves around the pitch at one metre intervals providing more entertainment than the second half could muster.

Hardcore fans were coaxed into sporadic chants in support of Jaingsu goaded by megaphone wielding MCs while drums banged a repetitive beat as the game played out in midfield. In the end, jubilant and proud supporters cheered as Sainty registered their first home win in the Asian Champions League.

The Shanghai Lu Hustlers

If you are a fan of the green baize then this monthly tournament takes place on the last Saturday of the month, the next being on 25th May. Put your name down, pay your fee and you have a chance to see your name on the pool wall, becoming in the process a part of Nanjing history.

That's Like Hand Moisturiser in a Shell!

Nanjing, a city filled with fake products and famous for its automobile trade, does not usually focus on the concept of traditional home-made cosmetics. However, it seems before the whole generation of counterfeit goods came along a few secret beauty products were created that since then have stood the test of time surprisingly well in the very fickle world of cosmetics.

In recent years we have seen more crazed news stories hit the headlines regarding highly dangerous chemicals that were found to be the main ingredients in some of our trusted cosmetics and skincare products; even more disturbingly it recently emerged that a lethal cocktail of potentially harmful ingredients ranging from high doses of lead, copper and mercury to arsenic and cadmium had been found therein, all of which can lead to severe skin allergies and in some cases permanent body and brain damage. Worryingly, the source of these products is not so far away. Even oversees scam artists had been buying these lethal potions and selling them on the likes of eBay as legitimate cosmetic brands, so living right here in China it is no wonder that most of us consciously make an effort to carefully check the ingredients and spend tons of cash

on supposedly safe products.

One local skincare fanatic and soap designer decided over four years ago that she too was sick of damaging skin care products filled with unnecessary additives and so decided to venture out on her own persuing a career in creating handmade products produced using natural ingredients and with the sole purpose of helping better the skin.



Rong Yu carefully and selectively designs and makes each individual bar of soap in her small Nanjing based studio using mud essence, olive oil, natural plant extract and almost any other natural ingredients she can get her hands on, but the most important and special ingredient is the mineral water from the hot springs which can be found nearby in Tangshan, to the east of Nanjing. There the hot springs are not only rich in minerals, but the water can effectively cure disease, reduce fatigue and reward skin with vitality and youth, which say no-more is reason enough to pay regular visits and use as a key ingredient in our skincare regime.



When asked what advantage does her soap have over some cheaper more attractive looking brands she provided me with the simple and scary realisation that I had wanted to brush aside

"Mass produced soaps use so many harmful chemicals that are only used to reduce price and make the products look and seem more appealing. For example, they add foaming agents to give it more lather, hardening chemicals to make it durable and harder to break, and extra preservatives to put a three to five year shelf life on the products. Such synthetic soaps will not only make your skin conditions worsen but will also leave your skin with no protection".

Rong Yu is working full time on her creations and besides helping the Tangshan tourism board, together with a friend she has created her own brand under the newly formed company Nanjing Tangshan Hot-Spring Bath Products Co. Ltd.

So with my 100% organic soap now purchased, I decided to look deeper into Nanjing's alternative hidden beauty secrets and surprisingly found a protective balm still in high demand especially with the older more beauty conscious generation. This moisturiser was created in the 1950's - 60's, and holds a less glamorous story with its sole purpose for being; to prevent cracked skin from bleeding and ultimately becoming infected. The substance made from oil and mixed with various spices is translucent like a Vaseline jelly perfect for dry elbows, knees and the bottom of cracked feet. The name "Wai Wai You" comes from the very novel idea of putting the cream in a clam shell, which is said to give the cream a longer shelf life. Back in the 1950s this popular cream could be found on any major shopping street around Nanjing; including Xinjiekou, SanShan Jie, ZhongHua Lu and Changle Lu. Today it can only be bought in small local markets, so it was not the easiest of products to find. Although I loved the idea of a clam shell being used, once opened it wasn't easy to close again and the scent was also not too inviting. However I found it fascinating to learn that in the '60s poor Jiangning farmers had no money to buy the Wai Wai cream and so created their own using refined fat oil, pond sludge and wood cuttings, which proved equally effective as the original. After learning this I was desperate to find a substitute, which I came across in your local Watsons store; one that was first made in 1931, just down the road in Shanghai.



Pehchaolin meaning a hundred sparrows' cream was originally formulated on a German creation and is said to be the first generation of modern cosmetics in China. The trend and only option at that time was to take your own bottle, tin or cup to give shop keepers, whom in return would fill the tin to your desired weight and charge accordingly, which in comparison to today's world seems like a very economical and environmentally protective idea. This concept was also applied to many other luxury goods at that time, including soy sauce and oil. There is no denying that today's whimsical designed tin catches your eye and would definitely give the likes of L'Occitane and other major skincare brands a run for their money; not only is the design stylish but the contents are rather impressive too. The scent is surprisingly addictive and the smooth solid cream blends gently into the skin. It does have a rather excessively greasy feel, but since it is made from oil, we can forgive them, especially after the first two minutes upon application when my hands felt baby soft and as though they had been gifted with a whole new lease of life. They were however, disturbingly white, but I guess that's why it remains popular amongst both old and young in China. The best part about this product is the price tag - ¥30. Who can grumble?

When I asked a local friend about this product and gave her the tin, she was instantly overwhelmed with nostalgic emotions and has since ditched her expensive hand creams and returned to her Grandmothers old beauty regime, one that I am now considering to use myself.

Starring a mix of Tarantino old timers such as Samuel L. Jackson and new golden boy Christoph Waltz, Django is a classic Tarantino, but then again it is not. 
However, every time I go there, or hear feedback from friends that have been too, or even check online reviews it is always a mixed bag. In terms of the food, the selection is great: I love being able to buy American food in Nanjing, and every time I step in Tribeca I feel like I'm at home at an Applebee's or TGIFs (blaces I spent a lot of time as an undergraduate and still go to with my friends.)

However, there is a lot of food at Tribeca that feels like American food with Chinese characteristics: Mozzarella sticks that taste like tempura served up with tarter sauce instead of marinara sauce, or the Caesar Salad not actually coming with or having any caesar dressing. Those small details really change the quality of the food, and how it tastes, especially for the

At Tribeca, interaction between the waiters and tables is a complicated affair. Different people set down utensils, take drink and food orders, and deliver the food; the result being miscommunication and forgotten items while the customer does not know with whom to interact and the staff have no personal responsibility for their satisfaction.

All that said, the integration of the uniforms with the atmosphere is amazing. It looks really great, and it's a comfortable environment. It is also clear the staff can speak some English, so that is a bonus, while the beer selection and the desserts appeal to me the most. If only the food could be a little more authentic, the staff more effective through the creation of a relationship between table and waiter, and with possibly more activities planned to keep people coming in, then Tribeca would be on to a real winner.


Trust Them
