

BUILDING A CHINESE

Recover a top secret isotope from a crashed spacecraft and along the way set off an explosive while nobody is inside the indicated blast radius." Such was the challenge laid down by "Now Get Out of That", a BBC television show that ran from 1981 to 1984, and now considered to have laid the foundations for "Survivor" type shows that include the likes of "I'm a Celebrity...Get Me Out of Here". It was also fantastic team building, although the term then had yet to be coined.

When an organisation breaks down, it is almost invariably manifest by a serious of collapses in relationships within the organisation. Hence the importance of team building.

While it can help in avoiding frayed relationships, so it can also assist with the bottom line. For their 1993 book, "Organizational change, design and work innovation: A meta-analysis of 131 North American field experiments, 1961–1991", authors Macy and Izumi conducted a study revealing that team development has a stronger effect on improving organisational structures than even the implementation of financial measures.

Fun is an important part of team building, but it should be remembered that the focus (and point) of the activity is for people to become productive, focused and aligned.

While team building is certainly becoming more popular for Chinese companies and many seem to understand the advantages, the methods employed are on the whole very generic in nature, with little creativity and few bespoke options available, e.g. ones tailored to a company's specific industry and/or individual needs. There is often too much of the aforementioned fun and too little focus.

The proliferation of local team building businesses is a testament to the fact that they are, after all, pretty easy to establish. All that is needed is a search of the Internet for "team building activities", a couple of instructors and a suitable park; one can easily come to a mutually beneficial relationship with the owners of such.

Until team building in China reaches a critical mass in terms of demand, there is therefore little reason for the suppliers to invest much more. In many ways, the term "team building" itself has become just another buzzword, also defined as "an English word that can be dropped into Chinese business conversations during meetings". Buzzword aside, there is a lot of team building in China comprising little more than superficial activities ("team recreation") that give employees some-

thing in the way of a morale boost, without any transfer of experience gained into the real world of work in an organisational structure.

So with all this mediocrity seeping in, again, Shanghai is where it's at. The city's employers are also more likely to have an open mind when it comes to offering their employees something different in the way of team building. In the middle of the city's Pudong District, The Jinqiao Arena has Bubble Football advertised on its menu of activities; strap on one of those large see-though plastic bubbles you see children paddling, and then simply play football, albeit a little violently.

Away from de-stressing and back in more familiar team building territory, the simple act of cooking might first appear to be an oft overlooked option. Cook In Shanghai organises Chinese cooking classes that also serve as the perfect team building exercise. Classes often include a visit to a local wet market and allow hands-on training for each participant. Co-operating with colleagues to make hand pulled noodles together is surely definitive team building!

Prior to undertaking any team building activities, it is vital to set out goals. In addition to addressing company specific issues (e.g. to understand what makes good content for a story in The Nanjinger), the following are ways in which team building can bring benefit to all organisations.

- I. Enable self development within teams
- 2. Make teams internally more innovative and harmonious (there, I said it); less in fighting
- 3. Increase acceptance of other view points
- 4. Bring about stress reduction
- 5. Have long lasting impact that can build success on top of success
- **6.** Help teams to understand company values and mission more clearly

The last point is perhaps the one that resonates most as a key outcome of team building exercises, to the extent that US worldwide management consulting firm McKinsey & Company "put[s] aside one day a year to reflect as a group on what our values mean to both our work and our lives" (www.mckinsey.com), what it calls "Values Day".

On his company blog, Gordon Orr, McKinsey Asia

The Plant is great at coming up with creative and unorthodox solutions, but is also likely to do so when least needed.



The Resource Investigator appropriates from the outside world and is a good networker but lousy at following up.



The Implementer delivers on time, creates action from ideas, embraces that which others shun but can be close minded.



The Co-ordinator sees the big picture and can confidently delegate until there is nothing else left to do.



The Shaper is task focused, agressively addicted to achievement and will challenge the team to ensure momentum is not lost.



The Specialist is an expert bringing great ability to a team who is also uninterested in that outside their sphere.



The Monitor Evaluator sees all with the greatest clarity, moves slowly and surely, but also lacks inspiration.



The Teamworker is a natural diplomat with skills underappreciated until absent; makes sure the little jobs get done.



The Completer/Finisher is a perfectionist, double checker and excessive worrier over minor details who refuses to delegate.

Chairman based in Shanghai, described a recent Values Day; "We were given a random stack of magazines and newspapers and asked to cut images and words from them to stick to a flip chart in a way that communicated our mission and values. This is a great exercise to do at the table as you discuss what a particular word or image means for one individual and see if it also resonates with the group."

Orr went on to add that the activity gave, "everyone at the table, from all roles in the office, the opportunity to describe what our values mean for them individually".

Another main driver of successful team building exercises is that everyone plays a different role to that which they perform each day at the office. In the above example, the Chairman took on the role of assistant. In this way, the prior experience (or lack thereof) of each participant is much reduced while it is also becomes not so simple for each to use the normal China hierarchy as defence. With groups arranged thus into unfamiliar situations, they face challenges around what each individual member of the team can bring to the table (see side bar on page 12) in terms of common sense, natural ability or mindset.

In order to effectively implement, and learn from, team building activities, a knowledge of the contribution made by the DNA of both team members and leaders is an absolute must. Team DNA is concerned with that part of our genetic makeup as it relates to interacting with others. Both as individuals and as a collective, such DNA helps us understand strengths and weaknesses in order to make better decisions as a group. As leaders, our effectiveness is best concentrated when we know how we ourselves operate and how so do others. Such knowledge becomes absolutely invaluable in times of pressure, working to meet a deadline, we need a good idea NOW, etc.

Good team building scenarios are people levellers; "Living the learning" is the term used in team building circles to describe the situations created for participants for which each has an equal level of knowledge.

They therefore face the tasks while confronted by only their own personality, opinions and behavioural problems, while learning how to work with those of their team mates.

"City Upside Down" is one of the activities offered by

Chinint, a team building specialist operating in Shanghai, Xiamen, Sanya, Beijing and Hong Kong. With a creative and original approach, participants are given budget and a set of clues, and go off to experience and discover Shanghai from a different angle, through challenges to pass and secrets to unlock that lead them to locations around the city.

When back in the office, many people perform the same set tasks every day, interact with the same set of colleagues, say many of the same things to them and if lucky, vary the lunch menu a little bit. Hardly surprising then, employees who have worked together for years often confess to barely knowing each other. That's where team building comes in. When the same colleagues are taken out of the office context and made to interact and cooperate in unfamiliar territory, their intense collaborative efforts quickly develops the relationship between them.

One of the under publicised advantages of team building exercises is the accelerated lead times. In the work place, any review of organisational decision making is muddied by there being many external factors and hundreds of variables that all play on an outcome, often over a long period of time. The undiluted team building environment, however, and its compressed time frame format provides for an excellent measure of the quality of decision making.

It is also a fact that disasters sometimes happen. In the real world work environment, they happen all the time. Team building offers a safe environment in which disasters can be made to happen, yet the consequences are limited, unlike in the real world. By being able to experience disorder, participants are able to work together to develop strategies that form a learning framework for managing this chaos.

Not to be outdone, Beijing based cultural experience provider The Hutong offers a unique collection of team building activities that could take employees along the Great Wall or up the Beijing Northern Hills. In their version of the scavenger hunt, participants must complete cultural challenges and interact with historical characters during the process. Even they also have a cooking class, leading us to wonder whether dicing and cutting with colleagues has become a team building cliché unto itself.

Back to the '80s and our crashed spacecraft. It may interest readers to know that "set off an explosive" was actually a euphemism for "pop a balloon".

While some may complain about being fed up with clichéd team-building activities; starting the day with a scavenger hunt, spending the afternoon in a boring keynote speaker session and heading home with cheap coffee mugs emblazoned with company logo, you might just feel lucky after learning of the extreme measures some Chinese companies take to foster so-called "team spirit".

Earlier this year the dancing "da mas" (old ladies) on Nanjing's Heyan Lu were upstaged by a maddened crowd of young people. It was just after 8.30 pm. when 11 young men and women gathered in a nearby square and started to shout, "Yes, we can! Yes, we can!", repeatedly as if under a spell.

Standing to attention on a freezing winter night, these young people seemed unaffected by the cold and warmed by each other's passion. One man who seemed to be the leader of the bunch stepped out and exclaimed to those gathered; "Is Jack Ma rich?" The fervent crowd

shouted their answer; "Yes!"
"Can we beat him?"
"Yes, we can!"

The leader went on to demand increasingly more outrageous behaviour. "Who would like to kiss the rubbish bin over there?"

"Me!", a young lad volunteered. To the astonishment of the da mas and passersby, he rushed to a nearby litter receptacle and offered it a gentle peck.

The crowd continued to shout slogans until, all of a sudden, everyone lay down on the cold hard ground upon the order given by the leader.

"I think they are crazy", one of the old ladies commented. So did many residents nearby and one of them eventually reported the strange antics to the local police. The overexcited crowd began to cool down when the police arrived at the scene. The leader told the police that they all belong to the sales team of a company nearby. Their jobs involve selling products door to door. "These are newbies, fresh out of college", said the leader. "They are too shy and timid. That's why we are pushing their limits."

The company concerned did not offer verification of the claim but online search results show that the firm is notorious for their so-called "creative training methods" for new recruits.

In China, similar motivational steps are adopted by a number of small companies that struggle to survive, especially sales companies, restaurants and hair salons. Apart from the most common approaches that are physical exercise and singing emotional songs together, there are also many other imaginative techniques employed to train young recruits, some of which date back many years.

On 15th April, 2005, a hair salon in Nanjing made their employees kneel down and "worship" passersby during rush hours on Shuiximen Da Jie.

Two years ago, a sales company in Guangdong forced their employee to run 5km on the street in their underwear as a punishment for failure to reach an annual sales target. One of the employees said he did not mind because he was told that billionaires all went through humiliations like this once.

Closer to home, in our neighbouring Zhejiang province, in April 2015 a web technology development company made its employees climb the local Huangren mountain in the middle of the night, again for not reaching a sales goal. They were also required to come to work by five in the morning and stand up while making phone calls.

Also in Zhejiang, a company in Ningbo made a new rule for all those in management to shave their head. Those who followed the rule would receive a \$10,000 reward (but must shave every month to remain bald) while those who refused to obey the rule were fired or required to pay a \$10,000 fine.

Another hotpot restaurant in Shenyang asked its employees to kneel down to their boss while shouting slogans. The restaurant said this scene was caught on tape for the purpose of propagating their unique corporate culture

Some of those companies brazenly claim that actions such as making their employees do push-ups, running marathons and even crawling on the street can help them reach their full potential and boost morale.

How do employees react to these incentives? When I threw this question to Xiao Li, my hairdresser, he smirked and asked me if I would like to start the day with 50 jumping jacks on the street at 6 am before heading back to wash 50 customers' heads for the day.

Wen Qing, an expert from the Nanjing 12355 Psychology Hotline said these so-called "motivations" are simply just wrong, and merely make employees feel frustrated and embarrassed.

"It can be even seen as humiliation of employees that further creates a negative impact on the company's image", Wen added.

Some years ago it was reported that quite a number of Chinese companies designed military training programmes for fledging young recruits. "The goal isn't to make the employees battle-ready, but to instil in them a sense of collectivism and obedience," one of the anonymous trainers said of the programs. A main goal was to "temper willpower".

Despite what these companies claimed, the whole purpose of team building activities should be to enable better communication, better relationships and ultimately increase productivity in the office. If a company truly strives to be successful, perhaps some time could be spent thinking about more worthwhile and encouraging methods of motivation, ones that do not involve kissing a rubbish bin. That would certainly be better than complaining about how mean your boss is.

Team Building Tales

Industrial plugs manufactuer, Nanjing based Mennekes, is one local firm embracing the power of team building. The Nanjinger caught up with some employees to see how it all went down



The last tea I introduced in Strainer; west China brick tea (砖茶), was the subject of historical intrigue and something of a personal quest. However today, I would like to spend some time with you discussing a true favourite of mine that is a stone cold classic; Yunnan Dianhong (云南滇红茶).

It is a source of constant frustration (especially during this confounded Milk Tea boom!) that even lovers of tea in China so badly under-appreciate the red teas (black tea in the west) produced here.

There is no excuse for neglecting great teas such as Keemun (祁门红茶) or Lapsang (拉普山小种). Well, at least in the case of Dianhong, perhaps the relative youth of the variety (a mere seventy or so years!) could be considered a kind of excuse; so too could the identity of this tea as an "export" tea.

Production only began in the late 1930s, with the stateowned China Tea Company recognising the high annual yield opportunity presented by the larger leaved Camellia Sinensis Assamica plants thriving in Yunnan. Since those days, tea from this area has been bought in large quantities by international blenders such as Lipton.

But the remarkable sweetness of these tea leaves (still produced by the modern Dianhong Group company) is best expressed in the full-leaf, high quality Dianhong teas; unavailable in supermarkets but sold by all dedicated pu'er sellers and by many others.

As you pay more (often for varieties called "gold" or

"tippy"), the higher the proportion of lighter coloured leaves you shall find in your batch. These pale, downy leaves are the veal meat of Dianhong; the spindly tips of the plant. Sure, there is generally more sweetness (as opposed to maltiness) in these tea leaves. But much satisfaction can be had from the mostly brown batches too. Furthermore, at Chinese prices of around \forall 200 per jin, this drink is firmly in everyday luxury territory.

Sweetness is a complex issue; teas can leave sweet after taste effects (known in Chinese as huigan). But this tea, even while filling the mouth, is about as sweet as tea gets. It is also this sweetness that somehow clings to the leaf for as many infusions as you wring it through.

The exact origin of this sweetness is a matter of some debate. Some have suggested that the oxidation processing of the leaves takes place in close proximity to lychee and longan fruit. This made sense to me when I first heard it; there are especially strong notes of the latter in the finished product. I would add to that a number of other "reminder" aromas, including tobacco, sweet potato and even granola!

So how exactly does this state-owned monopoly company produce its teas? This is a mystery I am eager to clear up. Certainly, a trip to Yunnan beckons. In the meantime, I am content to sip this fine example I picked up in a local tea market last month.

Oh, I forgot to mention: it's surprisingly good with a drop of fresh lemon juice. A fabulous comfort drink for changeable weather conditions!



There are few places in this city more cosy and serene than Zhu Yingchun's (朱嬴椿) office. The local Nanjing book designer artist and insect fanatic, known as Chun, graduated from Nanjing Normal University in 1995 with a degree in painting. For several years he worked tirelessly to meet deadlines at NNU publishing house, but still found the time to do what he loved; designing books. The first book of his own "Ant", published in 2007, was a turning point in his career and his life; it was also the same year he won a prestigious German prize for "The World's Most Beautiful Book". Welcoming me through his wicker gate with a smile as round as his glasses he told me a little more about his life and work.

Do you think of yourself as a book designer or an artist?

"I used to be a book designer, but now I am an artist. I never studied design, but when I started making books I was constantly drawing and making things and that way I discovered my talents. Making books is not design; it's turning books into art."

How did studying painting at NNU impact your work today?

"NNU teaches students to educate others, so we studied all kinds of painting not just Chinese painting. This helped me later when I began with my own work because I already had the basic skills in a wide range of things; painting, sculpture, film, although now I think in a different and more sophisticated way, so I can do all those things more successfully."

It strikes me you are very content and free in what you do. How did you get to this stage?

"I worked under a lot of pressure at the publishing house with very tight deadlines. It's important to have balance, first complete what's necessary and then do what you enjoy. As my own work became more and more fun, I had greater power to make my own decisions. Publishers approached me and I needn't worry whether or not my books would sell, so gradually I could make my hobby into my livelihood."


How did your interest in insects come about?

"It was after publishing my first book 'Ant'. At the time I was extremely busy and tired, like a little ant working away everyday. So I used ants to tell my own story and from there I began to observe other insects."

How do you work today?

"I empty my mind and become completely relaxed, then I discover all the things in nature that fascinate me, things I cannot grasp. I don't plan anything in advance; I wait for the insects come to me. It's the insects, not me, who make the art."

Your book "Chongzi Shu" is compiled from a collection of marks created by insects which look like Chinese characters, but are equally illegible to a Chinese or English speaker. Did you want to the book to have a particularly Chinese identity?



"Originally it had a more Chinese feel, for example all the 'text' was written vertically, but then I changed it to horizontal. I didn't want to make it too Chinese, I wanted people from all over the world to be equally captivated, otherwise they might just think 'oh it's a Chinese book' and put it down."

Do you think by displaying your artwork in books, people appreciate it in a different way?

"It's more convenient. It's not possible for all my work to be on display or for everyone to see it. Each book I make is a museum, it can be moved around and taken anywhere."

Finally, if you could speak to insects what would you say?

"I would say, don't think that people are greater than you; they are just different from you. Don't think that life is very short; a human's life is also very short in the universe. We are the same."

And would you like to spend a day as an insect?

"Yes. I could do one day. I wouldn't want to be an insect forever though, being human is still pretty good."

GHINESE DREAM PROJECT Young Chinese and the CPC

The Communist Party members, according to statistics from the Central Organising Department of China, come to 87.79 million by the end of 2015. Furthermore, 27.9 percent of them are students under 35 years old. Rather than "serve the people heart and soul", in fact, the real motivations of youth Party members are often the interests of themselves.

10th May is the day in Xiamen University when probationary Party members become formal members. "I'm so tired," said Wang Dali, a junior medical science student who had deeply breathed a sigh of relief after she realised she had qualified. Wang had submitted the application to be a Party member when she was a freshman. After two years of lectures in the Party's lead theories and organisation, she finally became a formal member.

The rules of the Party said that the one who apply for the Party's membership must have two references of the people who are already Party members. After one year's investigation and one year's probationary period, they can formally become a member of the Party.

Strict as the requirements to join the Party are, college students make up almost one third of new Party members; the reasons why they join are often about education and job-hunting.

Wang Hongsheng, a student from Tsinghua University, has become a Party member since he was a high school student. He paid all his attention on his study and didn't have any social experience so that his parents helped him arranged all of his life including whether to join the Party or not. "Many people said it will benefit my future development, so I joined the Party as my parents' willing. But nobody knows what the specific benefit really is," said Hongsheng.

With the development of China's economic system reform, young Chinese faced with more and more competition pressures. A number of big state-owned companies require their employees to have high degrees, political level (whether they are party members), work experience and so on.

Wang Xiaohui, a junior media student who is a probationary Party member in Nanjing University, wants to work in The People's Daily after graduation. There will be a greater chance to be admitted if she is a party member.

On the second Sunday of a semester, Nanjing University holds two political lectures for the probationary Party members. On that day, about 200 students have to stand in a long line to check in to attend the lecture. "As a probationary member, I have to attend. It's so boring but I'm so helpless." Xiaohui sighed.

There is to be be a leader's inspection of her department this Sunday, but no one is willing to attend as the lecture's audience, so the teacher said all Party members must attend. "Any lack in people's activities will become a political tool; our Party members are always controlled casually as free labour," Xiaohui complained on her WeChat. "It's unfair!"

Commenting on Xiaohui's post, Duoduo is Xiaohui's classmate who didn't join the Party. He can't understand why young Chinese must join the Party; "They are unlucky. Their obligations are much more than their rights".

"I want to study abroad and then get green card," simply answered by Duoduo. "Because Party members will have a lot of difficulties when they apply for a green card." Unlike those people just want to get good jobs through the Party, he is a typical example of a group of young Chinese who was influenced by globalisation and Internet.

Nowadays, teenagers become more self-considered and utilitarian, they join the Party just for their own interests. On the countary, some old Party members' opinions are different from the youth. Compared with young members, they have more willing to contributing to others and always consider the interests of the collective rather than themselves.

Wang Guixian, a 68-year-old retired primary school teacher and Party member, devoted all her time in teaching child. She believed that the concept of the Party is correct and it can teach people to do something to benefit society. What she thought and what she did is similar to other old Party members; they join the Party just in order to devote their ability and experience to others who need help.

"There were not so many benefits at the time I joined the Party. I just believed that the Party can bring us a better life," she said. "My granddaughter is a Party member too, I agree with her opinions to get more interests through the Party. After all, our society has already changed."

a hint of what this place was like 600 years ago. For "The Clear Tile Corridor" was once a market place for translucent tiles during the Ming Dynasty.

In the past, anything made from glass was considered a luxury. So as a substitute, people in ancient China ground oysters and clam shells and then mounted them on wooden grates

"Wandering around in Nanjing is like shopping in a boutique",

Zhu Ziqing, a famous Chinese essayist from the Republican era, once said. Indeed, 2,500 years of history over tendynasties has made Nanjing a city like no other.

Compared with the magnificent mausoleums and temples, the streets around Nanjing may seem too obscure to mention but some of them have also been around for over a thousand years.

Historic street names are a constant reminder of our city's colourful past. In an effort to preserve street names, the Nanjing Street Name Association launched a program at the end of last year to put QR codes on street sign posts for people to find out what stories lie behind the names. By scanning the QR code, one will find everything one needs to know about its origin, historical development and the surrounding area.

Mingwa Lang 明瓦廊

Anyone calling themself a true Nanjinger would not go to Confucius Temple if in need of an authentic bite of Nanjing. Mingwa Lang is the perfect destination that is well deserving of its reputation as "Nanjing office worker's canteen". Awaiting one here are juicy soup dumplings (小笼包), fried dumplings (锅贴), mouthwatering roasted duck (烤鴨) and so much more. Located parallel to Zhongshan Nan Lu, the Mingwa Lang street name gives us

to make translucent tiles for windows or ceilings.

But even oysters and clams were scarce in Nanjing as it cost too much to transport them from the sea and they tended to break easily. Instead, the clever craftsmen used goat horns. They boiled the horns into a jell sheet form and made them into tiles which were much more durable and cost less. These days, this type of translucent tiles can only be found in some ancient temples.

Note: Much of this information can also be found on a large plaque on the street side at the northern end of the street.

Wuyi Xiang 乌衣巷

Located amid the hustle and bustle of the Confucius Temple's southern corner, Wuyi Xiang was once an army base for Emperor Sun Quan between his reign from 222-280 CE. Since soldiers of Sun all wore black uniforms, people referred to them as the "Wuyi" (black clothes). We therefore know the alley as "Wuyi Xiang", or "Men in Black Alley".

Another piece of folklore surrounding the name's origins sheds a more mythical and romantic light on this alley. Once upon a time, between 3 and 6 CE, a noble man from Nanjing called Wang Xie was sailing one day when his ship capsized at the sea. Drifted for days holding onto a wooden board, Wang was finally rescued by an old couple who led him to their hometown, "The Black Cloak Kingdom" of the north, where everyone was dressed in black.

Wang Xie got married to the old couple's daughter but after a while he started to miss his home in Nanjing and decided to leave for the south. In her sadness at not being able to accompany him, his wife sent two swallows to follow him instead.

In the end, Wang came to realise that the Black Cloak Kingdom was actually made up of swallows and his wife was a swallow princess. She later sent him a goodbye poem saying she will not fly to the south ever again because it would hurt to see they could never be with each other. Wang did not see another swallow for the rest of his life.

While waiting, he wrote poems and songs for her that went, "Storm of impermanence! Anyone crossing is threatened by death. But don't worry my love! I shall wait here for you and keep you safe!"

During the Qing dynasty a bridge was built over the troubled waters to put an end to shipwrecks but the romantic tale of the couple lived on for centuries.

North Yinyang Yin 北阴阳营

One could easily walk past this small alley in Gulou district without paying it the slightest attention. Yet, this area used to be home to a primitive tribe of the earliest Nanjing residents some 5-6,000 years ago.

According to archaeologists, this was the perfect environment for our ancestors to hunt and gather as there were many hills with animals and fresh water sources. It is also interesting to note that polished river stones were found in the mouths of those who were buried here, proving that our fascination for these stones dated back as far as the Neolithic Age.

A total of 24 street sign posts carry such QR codes at present, namely 龙蟠中路、建康路、 贡院街、贡院西街、乌衣巷、大石 坝街、小石坝街、来燕路、大 全福巷、东牌楼、义兴巷、瞻 园路、中华路、桃叶渡(巷)、 党家巷、姚家巷、东关路、长白街、太平南路、长 乐路、白下路、莲子营、琵

乐路、白下路、莲子营、琵琶街 and 钞库街. Most are in the Confucius Temple area. In the future, the Nanjing Street Names Association aims to bring out street name QR codes for the entire city.

According to statistics, there are a total of 250,000 street names in Nanjing, but over the past 18 years, more than 1,900 have disappeared. The local government is stepping up efforts to protect this disappearing cultural her-

itage, among which is the publication of a book called "The Compilation of Nanjing Street Names".

"Streets are more than just simple names", says Ma Yongli, one of the compliation's authors, "They are a part of the entire historic fabric of the city. They should not be forgotten".

Later on people referred to the alley where Wang Xie's residence once lay as the "Wuyi Xiang" to mark the tragic love story between man and bird.

Taoye Du 桃叶渡

The "Peach Leaf Port" is also located near Confucius Temple. Legend has it that from the year 3 CE, renowned calligrapher and poet Wang Xianzhi lived there with his wife Taoye; "Peach Leaf".

What You Think You Look Like vs.

What You Really Look Like

f you are re ever in need of a short 5 minutes of procrastination, type this month's headline in to Google Images. Hilarious.... and you know why? Because, funny things are often those things to which we can relate. It's that moment where, in your mind, you are gracefully placed on your yoga mat, demonstrating the perfect triangle in your downward-facing dog. You glance up to the mirror to discover that your back is hunched, your sleek yoga pants have slipped, rather cruelly, to expose your winterwobbly midriff and, oh my... is one leg shorter than the other? The moment when you are pumped with your tunes, breaking in to a slight glow; you're feeling pretty good having cracked all the mysteries of the cable machine.... only to be interrupted by some well-meaning (hideous) person, who tells you that, in actual fact, you are posing a major health and safety risk by positioning yourself between the cables. "Oh".

But you know what? It's not what you look like... thank goodness, because some of those yoga poses are not kind on the eyes. But it IS important to use correct form. Correct form is the difference between injury and gains. 25 press-ups using poor form is likely to lead to injury, eventually, if not now. You are enormously better off correcting your form, and only being able to do 1 or 2 press-ups using correct form. In fact, it is essential. Tuck your pride in your compression vest and go back to basics.

So, how do you know if you are performing exercises correctly? Well, you will need a mirror or a willing friend with a video camera, and a stick; a broom stick or brush with a pole about 1.5 metres, and a simple functional screen, such as the one I shall detail below. A functional screen is a simple test which will reveal the location of some of your weaknesses:

Step 1 Dress right... you need to be able to see your feet, knees, torso and arms. T-shirt & shorts are fine

Step 2 Stand with your feet parallel between hip & shoulder length apart. Feet must be placed facing forward. Correct your feet if they should wander inwards or outwards.

Step 3 Take your stick and hold it on your head, so that your arms are making a 90 degree angle. Now push your arms up, until your elbows are fully extended.

Step 4 Squat as low as you can, move slowly, keep your arms stretched up and your body upright. Do four repetitions.

Now score vourself:

1 Do your feet stay aligned?

If your feet turn outwards, it could mean you have tight external hip rotators. Look for stretches you can do to loosen these, such as a seated hip stretch.

2 Do vour knees stav over vour feet?

If your knees move inwards, the muscle on the outside of your hip (gluteus medius) may need to be strengthened. Exercises such as the single leg lunge can help.

- 3 Do your heels stay on the floor?

 If your heels lift off the floor, you might have tight calf muscles.

 Look for exercises to loosen the soleus.
- 4 Do your hips reach parallel to the floor or lower?

 If you cannot get the depth in your squat, there could be a range of muscles that are not reaching their potential. Counterbalance squats and bridging will help.
- 5 Do your arms stay overhead?
 If your arms lean forward from your torso, then it is important for you to stretch the muscles of the chest. Look for exercises to stretch the scanula and latissimus dorsi muscle.

This basic functional screen is an indicator of muscles you might want to strengthen. It is not an in-depth analysis. What I hope to achieve is for you to be mindful of your form. Get your video function going, DO observe yourself in the mirror and analyse your form. Spend time correcting it. A word of warning; do not do this in a packed out gym, especially if you have a propensity for tight lycra and sweathands. It will kill your social standing. BUT, done in privacy or in a quiet spot of the gym with a friend... it will change your game and your gain. Most importantly, it will help to safe-guard against imbalance and injury.





Big Data...Big Money



2016 is set to be the year of big data. Given its implications and the population of China, this means very very big data. It also means different things for different people. China Daily is content for it to simply mean "big infographic", for BAT (Baidu, Alibaba, Tencent) it means goldmine, and for the individual it means unprecedented access to information covering every facet of modern life, and some of the more mundane too.

So how does big data really work? Well, it's simple really. So simple a computer can do it. What it all boils down to is databases, or specifically, relational database management systems (RDBMS).

Let's say you're growing a plant; a radish plant for example. Your website nanjingbigradish.com uses a MySQL database (named, interestingly, after co-founder Michael Widenius's daughter, My), as do a very large percentage of the world's websites, to store the data about your radish. As you go off outside trying to find buyers for your radish, your colleague enters information about it

into the website's database. You are then able to sit with your client and look at the website to show quantitive data over how nice and alobular is the root of your radish.

That's Step 1. Step 2 is to take out the part where you visit your clients. To do this, your website's database needs to "talk" to that of nanjingwetmarket.com. Suddenly now, there is a big league table of all the radishes in Nanjing; good news on one hand, as your market has become much bigger; bad news on the other, as you have to be more competitive.

The challenge of big data lies in the aforementioned talking between databases. Last month, the European Chamber of Commerce, Nanjing Chapter, held a one-day training course on big data on 10 March, that attracted members from the auto part, home appliance and airline industries. As well as really getting down to he nuts and bolts of those databases, the seminar was also a fascinating insight (albeit at times slightly over this correspondent's head) to the inner churning that powers the likes of Google and Facebook.

...Big BROTHER

Mei Zhang, General Manager EUCCC Nanjing, commented, "To transform the country from the world's factory into a more sophisticated manufacturing power, China has launched the initiatives of China Manufacturing 2025 and Internet+. Against this background, the European Chamber Nanjing has organised events centred on the initiatives, including big data, cloud computing and smart factory tour, to facilitate the exchange of knowledge and technology between members".

The State Council's action framework for promoting big data, as ratified by Premier Li Keqiang, seeks to establish a new model for social governance over the next 5-10 years. With an initial and ambitious deadline that is the end of next year, it seeks to create a data sharing platform between government departments that allows the general public to access all manner of data, including that relating tocredit, transport, health, employment, culture, education, science, agriculture, finance and weather.

In the words of an official statement released by the Council, "the government will set up an overall coordination mechanism for big data development and application, speed up the establishment of relevant rules, and encourage cooperation between the government, enterprises and institutions".

That's all very well, and it certainly sounds nice, on the surface. However, it is banded about that' the most important (read "profitable") use of consumer data is the extraction of purchase preferences and patterns to create highly targeted value-added services and products. Since knowing I was going to have to write this article, I have been struggling to get to get to grips with what makes me so

uncomfortable about this, and finally I know. It's the big brother of it all.


According to an article on the website ClickZ, "Baidu alone has thousands of analysts assessing data every day – will give retailers and other industries unprecedented accuracy in profiling the people buying their products and using their services, rich in both detail and opportunity". That was two years ago; imagine how many they have now.

One such data exploitation has been made by Alibaba, in it taking the data accumulated by its online shops to assess a borrower's ability to repay a loan. Juxtapose this with George Orwell's "1984" in which the Party [not to be confused] presents its vision of the future; "Always there will be the intoxication of power, constantly increasing and constantly growing subtler", and my fears have become manifest.

Big data also pushes the individual out of the window, attempting to reduce us to averages, those that statistically say I should he interested in this, as are x percent of "similar people".

Have we been enriched by big data? Is everything that much better because of it? The fact that I have driven down to Metro should be indication enough that I don't care that one particular product is 0.9 kuai cheaper than at Auchan, so why waste my time on the opportunity cost presented by having to go through the chaos that your car park represents? Big data can't work that out for you? Your text messages are nothing more than a nuisance.

Next time around, we hope for "big data; big interest". In the meantime, what I would like to see a lot more of is, Small Data. Let's see if the government can deliver that by 2017.



ots of natural light, contemporary design and fair-trade organic espresso. If this combination doesn't immediately bring the picture of Nanjing's coffee shops to your mind, i am not surprised. Goldstar Café on Shanghai Lu however is trying to change that.

In September of last year the Canada based company opened the doors of its first store in China, here in Nan-jing. Bringing with them, what they call a "boutique hotel lobby lifestyle". Goldstar Café aims to be a luxury café with an Scandinavian style and does a good job to fulfill this, not only in decor and quality but also with its prices.

My personal favorite is the Sri Lanka black tea, which is one of only two teas Gold Star has to offer. What the menu does not tell you however is that you're not paying for only one cup but for a pot of tea, served with two slices of green lemon, a thermos jug of hot water, two cups and a small plate of cookies. This combination makes the stiff price of ¥48 way more reasonable.

On the coffee front i was very pleased with the espresso (¥18), which was neither too sour nor too bitter, as well as with the latte (¥28) and its heart-shaped foam on top. It is worth mentioning that Gold Star uses its own fair-trade and organic coffee blend, which they import from Canada and also sell in their local store.

If you feel hungry, the menu does not only offer cake but also a variety of finger food and filling meals. From Sandwich, French Fries and Popcorn Chicken to Salad, Chicken Rice and Pizza the overall quality is very pleasing but doesn't come cheap. The spicy Pizza with beef and chili peppers (¥68) is not amongst Nanjing's top five but fairly good for a coffee shop and makes you wonder if they learned a thing or two from the nearby Italian restaurant.

The staff is noticeably concerned to keep the customers happy, which also results in keeping the place rigorously clean. One of my Chinese friends even remarked how the bathroom with its western style toilets make him feel like in a fancy hotel.



The interior design is visually pleasing, with the bright white walls contributing to the overall clean and calm atmosphere. The big windows fill the space with natural light which makes it a great alternative to the typical dimmed down and cozy coffee shops. On warmer days you can also enjoy your coffee on the outside terrace. Fancied by Chinese people and foreigners alike, Gold Star Café is a good place for a coffee date with a friend but thanks to the decent WiFi and many wall sockets, it doesn't fall short as an remote work station either. The only downside is their country CD by Chely Wright that literally seems to hunt me down and is sometimes even played more than once while I am there, hence I always make sure to bring my headphones with me if I intend to study. Since they keep their doors open until I Ipm, you do however have lots of time to get your work done.



I found the café to have friendly and attentive service, good organic coffee and an overall great design, which makes it definitely worth checking out. And facing the fact that it is not always easy to find a free table, it seems like i am not the only one who feels that way.

Scotland Upstairs; England & Ireland Downstairs

Therefore, when they rock into town, it's time to get out the big guns. After all, we don't want them headed back to the "Hu" blagging about how uncouth Nanjing is.



With its business card that is two millimetres thick, The Malt Room sets out from the start to install a sense of quality. That it sits atop the premier Irish bar in Nanjing;

Finnegans Wake, is also a help. Even the most demanding "sanhaining" is sure to be impressed.

Downstairs, Finnegans Wake serves up an array of signature British dishes, all so obvious it is very surprising they are at best sparse on the menus of other international restaurants in town; classics such as Roast Beef, Steak and Guinness Pie plus Fish and Chips. Then there is a Full Breakfast; again, there are sufficient party animals in Nanjing in need of sustenance on early weekend afternoons that you would think a few more places would be offering it.

I digress.

That the menu also offers more than a nod to the land north of the England-Scotland border, in Haggis and Clootie Dumpling (surely the only place serving this delight in all of China?), serves as a hint to the fact that the owner is Scottish (staff are also impeccably dressed in tartan) and a preview of what lies in wait up the stairs when it comes time for that all important digestif. Elsewhere on the menu, and in the case one has gone for "The Daddy" that is a triple decker burger (a snip at ¥150), the tipple invented as an aid to digestion may be a more than necessary evil.

Opened towards the end of last year, the Malt Room follows the same discerning sense for standards that has stood the 'Wake in good stead since 2008, standards that, to be frank, leave one feeling as if one has stepped out of China. Big old fashioned armchairs, dark wood and soft lighting mean one could be in a book shop in colonial Singapore. Throw in an unrivalled selection of Scotch whisky and, were it not for these days of political correctness, a cigar would also likely be mandatory.

The Malt Room boasts a collection of whiskies from the finest and oldest single malt Scotch whisky distilleries in the world, one that springs from every corner of the little country, each with a character as rich and complex as its history, and as fresh as the landscape that surrounds.

As well as hanging around in hopes that one may ask for a refill, staff at The Malt Room are also happy to introduce this enchanting world, and guide one through the what, why and how of whisky; all facilitated by a back room dominated by an overbearing map of Scotland and its distilleries that feels about ready to leap off the wall and challenge one to a drinking contest.

From a personal perspective, The Malt Room passes my not so acid test; the mere stocking of Talisker, one of the

six Classic Malts, chosen as being best representative of Scotland's principal whisky producing regions. What it all boils down to is the local water and the choice of wood for the barrels that do the "finishing", in Talisker's case a Spanish sherry.



For water is indeed the key; Scotland's most famous poet, Robert Burns, himself claimed that should one meet the devil, one would only survive if fortified with "uisge beatha"; whisky, the water of life.

Sun Palace Reborn

Situated at the base of purple mountain and a landmark at the east side of Xuanwu Lake with its distinctive dome structure, Sun Palace (太阳宫) was the largest indoor water park in Nanjing when it opened 2003.

When I was little, this was the perfect place to escape Nanjing's sweltering heat in summer. I remember floating on the man-made "river" inside, watching the August sunrays shining through the glass dome above me. I could not help but feel nostalgic when it went out of business in 2010 and mould started to creep over its exterior. Rumor had it that the former-day palace would be demolished altogether as it had become a sore to the eye.


Then in 2014 heavy construction began which promised to turn Sun Palace into a brand new entertainment complex with restaurants, theatre, shopping mall and ocean themed fitness center iGYM. After two years of waiting, it is ready to face the public again around the middle of April.

Since iGYM is the first facility to open and offers free tryouts, I went inside the restored Sun Palace for the first time after 8 years. Founded in Shandong in 2004, iGYM now has 33 branches across the country. Each has its unique decoration and in Nanjing's case, this is a 3,000 sqm. ocean themed fitness centre with dazzling neon lights and dolphin shaped balloons.

It features an indoor 25m by 15m swimming pool at 28 degrees all year around. Now in its last stage of furnishing, the pool will be open to the public by 10 April.

As for the fitness equipment, iGYM Nanjing boasts 22 imported LifeFitness treadmills, each supposedly worth over ¥260,000 and 8 elliptical machines. Personal trainers are very helpful as they stick around and ready to offer you body building tips and advice.

Rui Songqing, a former soldier in the special forces and internationally credited personal trainer, ran a fitness exam on me with the latest technology of body composition analysis and designed my personal training schedule.




Apart from their highly qualified instructors, iGYM also offers fitness programs that includes 10 of the LesMills' trademarked aerobic classes covering spin, kickboxing, yoga, pilates, etc.

Overall iGYM provides a first-class professional training atmosphere and much personal attention from the staff. As I was tempted by the chance to swim again in Sun Palace and ready to register for a membership, a grandpa who seemed like a bodybuilder looked around the fancy surroundings and laughed, "I'm not paying ¥3,880 yuan a year when I can run alongside the beautiful Xuanwu Lake, or swim in Baima park, everyday for free!" Well, now I feel a bit embarrassed.



THE NANIINGER BUS TABLE






Notes on using The Nanjinger Bus Table

FOOD LABELLING & FAIR COMPETITION

■ The wide and important field of food safety law has been recently explored, analysed, studied and explained all over the world. As a matter of fact, this particular branch of legislation is one of the few in which doctrine is not divided into distinguished schools of thought.

China vs. USA

In the two biggest Countries; PRC and USA, solutions utilised to regulate food labelling are different. In China, the State is invested in a paternalistic control over citizens while in the USA, the lobbies govern (as with much else) how the food market operates. No matter; the results are identical in the visuals of the labelling, where citizens, in both countries, were (and often, still nowadays, are) not properly informed.

Confucius vs. Lobbyist

In other words, changing the point of view from the political and economic to those of citizens, neither a Chinese consumer nor an American consumer enjoys accurate information regarding their foodstuffs, meaning neither are free to choose their own diet, take risks according to their own feeling, select which product is the most appropriate for the growth of their children, etc. Expanding on the aforementioned principles, the Chinese system deems it appropriate to operate exemplified choices for its citizens, operating from the assumption that knowledge is held by the rulers (in a revised Confucian political philosophy) and not by common people. On the other hand, in the American system, liberal in its declarations but dominated by other kinds of bureaucracies, In particular (not the political, but) the lobbyist types, such choices are made by the ruling economical powers. And while China's power choices are aimed at protecting the health of citizens, as a parent protects the health of their own children, those of the US are aimed at "protecting" an uncovered unfair competition", as pointed out by consumers' associations.

A United Humankind

Those two visions, so far from each other in approach, share a common feature; one system protects the health, the other the competition, but neither protect both fundamental aspects.

Another area with common ground, not only between China and the US, but all of human society, is that of the importance of a functional food labelling system, in which public administrations set forth general rules, companies comply, citizens control and tribunals protect.

Food labelling's peculiarity is the development of a unique issue for two main reasons and legal goals; on the one hand, informing consumers by providing a complete, non-misleading, truthful, etc. labelling system that means ensuring the truthfulness of the quality of the food it represents; on the other hand, ensuring fair competition.

These considerations lead us to the core of the labelling regime; a system of "subsidiary controls", in which the State issues general rules with the will of protecting the right to healthy and fair competition, the companies act as issuer and the consumers act as controllers, all in full respect of the principle of subsidiarity.

In this way, trusting consumers' knowledge and opinions, a good labelling system shall mean a good system for the food law itself. Syllogistically, indeed, if it is true that the label shows the content (and this task is given to the legislator and the enactors) and, at the same time, that the label is truthful, then the content is also truthful.

Furthermore, in a proper labelling regime, no company would logically be able to provide false or misleading declaration, as this would mean a (marketing and procedural) failure of the company. In other words, a truthful, complete and non-misleading label shall mean a higher level of respect for human health and fair competition.
